

Township of Bates July 3rd A.D. 1893.
 A special Election was held in the School House on School District No. 1 in the Township of Bates on the 3rd day of July - A.D. 1893 As soon as the inspectors of Election was assembled they appointed John E. Froulund as assistant Clerk of Election The Board of Election inspectors then consisted of the following Persons Carl J. Gustafson Chairman Israel Carlson Clerk Charles A. Otto and John Granberg inspectors John E. Froulund Assistant Clerk After the above named members of the Board had taken the Constitutional oath of office prescribed by law the Pool was opened and continued open until five o'clock in the afternoon with the exception from 12. to 1. o'clock at which time the Board adjourned for one hour: after having sealed the ballot boxes as Required by law after Closing the Pool the votes was publicly counted by the Board of inspectors, and the Result was Read by Israel Carlson Clerk of said Election and drew up the following Statement

A Statement setting forth the whole number of votes cast at the said Election was (35) thirty five the whole number of votes cast for the adoption of the County Road System was (30) yes thirty the whole number of votes cast against the adoption of the County Road system was (5) no five
