

Township of Bates November 4th A.D. 1902
 The following are the Minutes of the proceedings
 of the General Election held in the Township
 of Bates on the 4th day of November A.D. 1902
 in the School house of said township.
 November 4th 1902 7 A.M. The board of
 Inspectors of Election was organized with
 Charley Olson, as Chairman, Israel Carlson,
 Clerk, Olof Tryborn, and Emil Evans,
 as Inspectors and Olof Helgenia as
 second Clerk. The Inspectors on motion
 appointed Victor Forsberg as Gate keeper
 the constitutional oath of office were
 then administered to the Inspectors
 Clerks and Gate keepers, such oaths are
 in writing and are in the poll books
 provided for this day and on file in the
 Clerks office. The ballot box kept by the
 Township Clerk was then examined by the Chairman
 and inspectors and the contents removed therefrom
 and was then locked by the Chairman and they
 key thereof delivered to one of the inspectors
 the Chairman then announced that the polls
 was now duly open for balloting and voting
 commenced by ballot. at 12 o'clock noon
 the polls were closed according to proclama-
 - mation made the inspectors. at 1 o'clock the
 polls were duly opened and remain open
 untill 5 o'clock in the afternoon at which
 time the Chairman stated that the
 polls were now closed and the polls were
 closed. The votes were then duly canvassed
 according to the statute in such case
 made and provided after the tickets had
 been entered the result thereof and the
 votes each one received by each candidate
 one person on the ticket was the publicly

Declared by one of the inspectors and a duplicate statement of said result showing the whole number of votes cast for each office the names of each persons for whom each votes were cast and the number each received were prepared forthwith and duly filed according to Law.
